- Establishment and future maintenance of a NFCC web based site

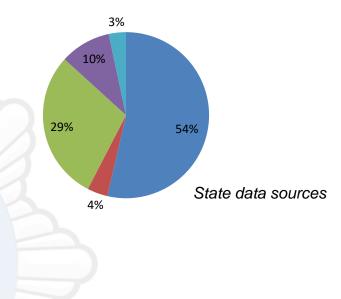
