THE ROAD VEHICLES (CONSTRUCTION AND USE) (AMBULANCE AND FIRE VEHICLES) (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER 2019

The Secretary of State makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 44 of the Road Traffic Act 1988¹.

Citation, commencement and expiry

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) (Ambulance and Fire Vehicles) (Great Britain) Order 2019.
- This Order comes into force on 1 November 2019 and will cease to have effect on 1 November 2023.
- 3. This Order extends to Great Britain.

Application

- 4. This order applies to any vehicle used by or on behalf of any of the NHS ambulance services or fire and rescue authorities listed in the schedule to this Order and that is driven primarily by an NHS ambulance service or fire and rescue authority responder or member of staff, and -
 - (i) is being used for an ambulance purpose, including for the purpose of providing a response to an emergency at the request of an NHS ambulance service to which this Order applies, or
 - (ii) is being used for a fire and rescue authority purpose, or
 - (iii) is being driven for purposes necessary to ensure the continued availability of the vehicle for a purpose specified in subparagraphs (i) or (ii) above.

Authorisation

- 5. The Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986² have effect in relation to vehicles to which this Order applies as if the following modifications were made to regulation 109(1):
 - (i) in sub-paragraph (c), the word "or" is omitted; and
 - (ii) after sub-paragraph (d), after the word "destination", the following is inserted-
 - (e) about the location of other vehicles;

- (f) related to the operation, settings and control of approved emergency services communications systems, the display of still images and symbols used to communicate urgent ambulance or fire and rescue service information by such approved emergency services communications systems; or
- (g) any other additional information to assist an ambulance or fire and rescue service responder or member of staff in the execution of their duties, provided that such additional information can only be visible to the driver at times when the speed of the vehicle to which the apparatus is fitted does not exceed 7 miles per hour."

Notes for Guidance. (These are not part of the Order)

1. Any information permitted to be displayed under regulation 109(1)(g) of the Road Vehicle (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986, as modified by article 5 of this Order, should not be visible to the driver of a vehicle whilst it is in motion, and systems are expected to be designed to cut out such displays as soon as they detect that the vehicle is in motion.

The speed allowance of 7mph is included in the modified regulation to allow for detection delays and limitations in equipment sensitivity, regardless of whether vehicle motion is detected by satellite positioning or vehicle sensors.

2. Whereas this Order modifies regulation 109(1) to allow ambulance or fire and rescue service information which is operationally necessary to be visible to drivers, it is not intended to allow communication by text beyond that which is ancillary to the operation of onboard systems. Text communication and text data records give rise to an unacceptable risk of driver distraction and may not be visible to the driver whilst the vehicle is in motion as per regulation 109(1)(g), as modified by this Order.
