



Emergency Response Driving Instructor Course Outline for Class 2 vehicles

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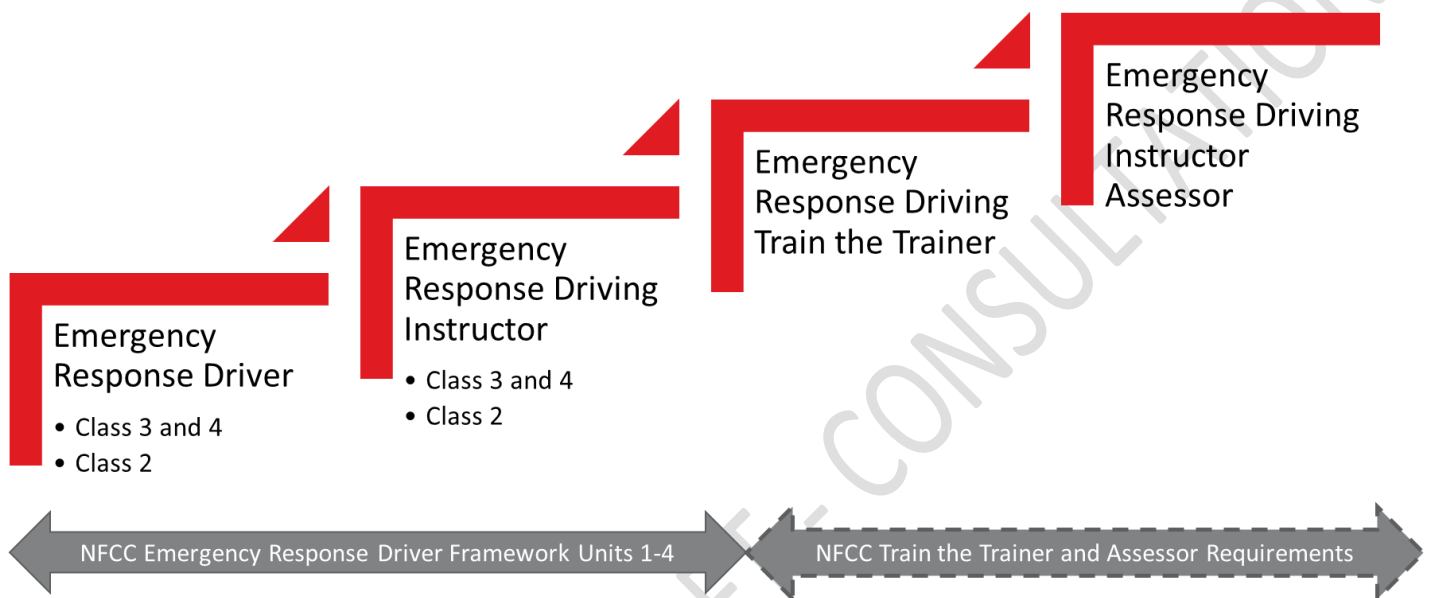
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Emergency Response Driver Training Instructor and Assessor Pathway

To support fire and rescue services in achieving the [Emergency Response Driving Fire Standard](#) and be compliant with legislation, a learning and development pathway for all new Emergency Response Driver (ERD) instructors/assessors, as illustrated below.

ERD Pathway for fire and rescue services



The pathway has been developed through the Driver Training Advisory Group (DTAG) Fire and in line with the NFCC Emergency Response Driver and Instructor Framework (NFCC ERD Framework).

A part of that pathway is to provide a nationally consistent training course for driving instructors who are emergency response drivers required to deliver ERD training in line with [Unit 1 of the NFCC ERD Framework](#) or to assess who have completed training.

This instructor course is comprised of four modules summarised below. Successful completion of these modules qualifies an instructor to deliver emergency response driver training (ERDT) in fire appliances. The modules will need to be completed in order.

- Module 1 – Emergency Response Driver (ERD) Instructor Training (120 hours with an approved training provider)
- Module 2 – 80-hour (Class 2) Course Observation (in service)
- Module 3 – 80-hour (Class 2) Observed Delivery (in service)
- Module 4 – (Class 2) Independent assessment of an initial course final drive

Successful completion by the student in modules 1 to 4 will result in them being approved as an NFCC ERD Instructor and placed on the NFCC ERD Instructor register for Class 2 vehicles.

After successful completion of the Class 2¹ vehicle course (modules 1 to 4), if a service also wishes an instructor to deliver training in Class 3 and 4² vehicles, the instructor will need to complete the **Class 3 and 4 vehicles course** (modules 1 to 4).

This modular design enables fire and rescue services the flexibility to train new instructors to the required professional and legislative standards and requirements.

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¹ Class 2 is category B (car)

² Class 3 is category C1 (medium vehicle), Class 4 is a category C (Large/Long Goods Vehicle)

Course details

Who should attend?

- Current emergency response drivers employed by or contracted to a fire and rescue service who wish to progress to an ERD driving instructor and provide ERD training (students may be operational or non-operational employees)
- Potential Class 2 ERD instructors employed by or contracted to a fire and rescue service who need to train in Class 2 vehicles

Prerequisites for student

The minimum prerequisites to undertake training in Module 1:

- Approved prior learning completed
- Class 2 driving licence
- Successful completion of NFCC ERD Framework Unit 1 (80-hour course in Class 2 vehicle)
- Level 3 Adult Education and Training (AET) award
- Level 3 Assessors qualification or award

Services may wish to consider equivalent approved prior learning or other sector experience as part of selecting students to become ERD instructors. They should carry out a training needs analysis in order to clarify any further development or qualifications the student may require.

Students are allowed three attempts to pass each of the modules, and this process should be completed within 18 months of starting the course.

Delivery of Module 1

Module 1 is a 120-hour course delivered by an NFCC approved provider.

The learning outcomes of Module 1 are:

- Educational demonstration driving
- Lesson preparation and delivery
- Instructional techniques
- Conducting assessments

The course must follow the contents of this NFCC ERD Instructor Course Outline and associated materials.

Final assessment of students completing Module 1 must be carried out by an assessor, independent from the student's training provider and approved through the NFCC.

Upon successful completion of Module 1, students will then have to complete Modules 2, 3 and 4.

ERDT instructor credentials

Module 1 must be delivered through an approved training provider with an NFCC approved ERD instructor, who holds the following credentials:

- Approved instructor on NFCC ERD register
- Large goods vehicle (LGV) Class 4 driving licence - held for minimum of 5 years
- Minimum 5 years' experience and evidence of conducting ERD training and assessments
- Level 3 Adult Education and Training (AET) award
- Level 3 Assessors qualification or award

Course ratio

The accepted ratio for the ERD instructor course is two students to one qualified ERDT instructor (2:1).

Delivery of Modules 2, 3 and 4

Modules 2 and 3 can be completed 'in-service' on courses which are aligned to the NFCC ERD Framework.

Module 2

In this module, the student must observe an 80-hour (Class 2) ERD Course being delivered by an approved NFCC instructor.

Module 3

In this module, the student must deliver an 80-hour (Class 2) ERD course observed by an approved NFCC ERD instructor.

Module 4

In this module the student will complete a final drive in a Class 2 vehicle, independently assessed by an NFCC approved assessor.

Pre-course joining instructions and information

- Pre-course learning materials:
 - Roadcraft manual
 - The Highway Code
 - Driving at Work policy
- Appropriate clothing must be worn during training in line with training provider's policy
- Start times vary throughout the course in line with training provider's timetable
- All pre-course learning and support material will be sent to student prior to training
- Students with specific learning or cultural needs must discuss them with their training provider at the earliest opportunity, preferably prior to attendance.
- Training providers should make any adjustments to their training delivery in line with any identified student learning and cultural needs.

Summary of assessment process:

- Evidence of meeting learning outcomes collated on the NFCC ERD portfolio by the instructor. Any areas for improvement will be discussed with the student and noted within the portfolio.
- Students sit a written examination on the first day (a.m.); failure to achieve the pass mark will result in a resit of the examination later in the course.
- The exam includes:
 - 20 questions on Roadcraft
 - 20 questions on The Highway Code
 - 20 questions on road signs
 - 10 questions on service policy and legal exemptions
 - 10 questions on vehicle stability and siting at incidents
- Assessment of student's initial and final driving skills
- Assessment of student's instructional technique
